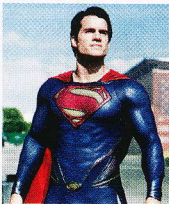
**SUNDAY

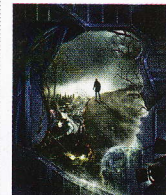
